1a.1. Teaching experience	Maximum	Score obtained
<p>Minimum requirement* (10 points): The Applicant is required to have taught at least 800 contact hours (including at least 100 hours of lectures) at any higher education institution during the ten active years preceding the submission of the Application. The teaching activity must be certified by the Applicant's direct superior, and the relevant student feedback results for at least the last five active years must be provided. In the absence of student feedback, the assessment of the Applicant's direct supervisor is also acceptable.</p> <p>Specific criteria for the minimum number of hours to be completed: of the 800 contact hours, a maximum of 600 hours may be taught in vocational higher education, bachelor's degree and postgraduate studies.</p> <div><p>¹Foreign Applicants: proof of contact hours does not need to come from the Applicant's direct superior. Instead, other acceptable forms of verification from their country can be used. For example, this might include a certificate from the dean's office or a detailed list of courses making up the contact hours, which must include the course titles, the institution/faculty/subject names, the level of education (bachelor, master, doctoral), and the dates.</p><p>With respect to student feedback on teaching activity, the information resulting from the processes of the given country must be taken into account.</p></div>	10	
<p>Additional points for teaching activities: 20 points are given for a total of 1000 contact hours, 30 points for a total of 1200 contact hours, and 40 points for a total of 1600 contact hours.</p> <p>For educational performance (1a.1.), the minimum requirement is 800 contact hours (including 100 hours of lectures), for which the Applicant is given 10 points.</p>	40	

¹**Foreign Applicants are:** a) Applicants who are not Hungarian citizens, and b) Applicants who are Hungarian citizens working abroad on a long-term basis (more than five years).



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<p>In total, for 1600 contact hours (including 200 hours of lectures) a maximum of 50 points may be given (including the minimum requirement). Between the maximum and the minimum, the score is determined proportionally and must be rounded to the nearest whole number.</p> <p>A maximum of 25 (10+15) points may be given for contact hours where the Applicant did not attach student feedback or where student feedback result was below 3.50. In the absence of student feedback, the assessment of the Applicant's direct superior is also acceptable.</p>		
<p>1a.2. Supervising the academic and scientific work of students</p> <p><u>Minimum requirement* (5 points):</u> The Applicant is required to have supervised at least 20 theses and/or dissertations, or has been a consultant to OTDK theses (co-supervision is worth 0.5 point). A TDK thesis may be included in the minimum requirement if it has won a prize at the OTDK.</p>	5	
<p><u>Additional points may be given for:</u> Ten more examples of supervising activities.</p> <p><u>Special criterion:</u> extracurricular activities, remedial education, talent management, leading a student circle, supervising students' work at faculty, university, national conferences, competitions, Master Teacher title, successfully preparing a courtroom speech contests, preparing students for an international seminar, conference, prizes received, professional-scientific publications of supervised students, organisation of professional quizzes and competitions.</p> <div data-bbox="204 1144 1161 1229" style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px;"> <p><u>Special criteria for foreign Applicants:</u> student talent development activity (instead of TDK/OTDK supervision).</p> </div>	5

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<p><u>Minimum requirement* (5 points):</u> The Applicant is required to have delivered at least 80 contact hours (including guest teaching assignments at foreign higher education institutions) up to the date of submission of the application, as certified by the Applicant's direct superior. For example, Erasmus Mobility, guest lecturer invitations, summer/winter university courses, certified lectures can be credited as foreign language higher education experience.</p> <p><u>Foreign Applicants:</u> in the case of non-native English speakers, the “foreign language” criterion may be replaced by a language relevant to international scientific communication (which is foreign to the Applicant). In the case of native English-speaking Applicants, since the language of international scientific communication is English today, giving lectures, practice sessions, or seminars in another language is not a requirement. Teaching activities as an invited or visiting lecturer conducted at a university outside the Applicant's country may be accepted, but 80 hours is not a minimum requirement.</p>	5

<p>1b.1. <u>Minimum requirement* (10 points):</u> The Applicant is subject director of at least one compulsory (type "A") course or at least two optional (type "B" or "C") subjects in the ten active years preceding the application, verified by the direct superior (one compulsory subject 10 points or two optional subjects 10 points). <i>Certification by the direct superior is not taken into account in the evaluation process for applications during the application period starting on May 13, 2025.</i></p> <p><u>For foreign Applicants:</u> overall responsibility for courses may be substituted for activities leading and/or managing programmes, courses or projects. (However, participation in research/development/innovation projects should be accounted for and evaluated under item 2b.1)</p>	10	
<p><u>Additional points can be given:</u> another 4 points for acting as course director for one subject or meaningful participation in the development of two more subjects.</p>	4	
<p>1b.2. <u>Minimum requirement* (5 points):</u> the Applicant is the sole author or having authored at least 50% of at least one textbook or course book, or at least one teaching aid or digital teaching material comprising at least 8 author's sheets.</p>	5

<p>Internationally recognised, outstanding scientific achievements.</p> <p><u>Minimum requirement* (30 points):</u></p> <p>A) At least two Q1 or Q2 international publications in a foreign language in a field relevant to the field of the Applicant, or in the Hungarian Academy of Sciences' IX. An article in category A or B international journals of the Section of Economics and Law or at least one monograph published in a foreign language by a renowned international publisher.</p> <p>B) The Applicant must be the sole author of at least one peer reviewed monograph, which must be different from the Applicant's PhD dissertation.</p> <p>C) In addition, the Applicant is expected to present at least 20 scientific journal articles, papers or edited book chapters (journals must be Hungarian Academy of Sciences' IX. Section A-B category in Hungary and international A-B-C-D or Q1-Q2-Q3).</p> <p>D) A Hirsch index of at least 8, calculated on the basis of independent citations, is also a minimum requirement.</p> <p>E) The minimum requirement is at least 150 independent citations of scientific publications, of which at least 30 must be in foreign languages.</p> <p>If these five conditions [A), B), C), D) and E)] are met, 30 points may be awarded. In the event that any of these five conditions (A), (B), (C), (D) and (E) are not met, no points may be given for 2a.1.</p> <div style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px; margin-top: 10px;"> <p><u>Foreign Applicants:</u> the criteria "foreign language" and "international publisher" can be met by a work published in an international journal or by an internationally renowned publisher. In the case of native English-speaking Applicants, publication in another language is not required. In the case of non-native English speaking Applicants, publication in a (foreign) language relevant to international scientific communication is required.</p> </div>	30	
<p><u>Additional points may be given for:</u></p> <p>Scientific publications in at least ten foreign languages in addition to the minimum requirements, including only research papers published in scientific journals, and peer-reviewed books and book chapters.</p>	10	
<p>A further 150 independent citations to scientific publications, including at least 60 foreign language citations.</p> <p>If the Applicant is the head of a Lendület team of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences or has won an ERC Starting Grant, he/she is given at least 20 points in the field of scientific achievements.</p> <p>Applicants who obtained the title Doctor of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences no more than 10 years before submission of the application are considered to have met the criteria for outstanding scientific or research (point 2a.1 of the evaluation sheet) and are to be evaluated with a maximum score of (50).</p>	10
