The MAB Board supports the accreditation of Schneider Children's Medical Center (Petha Tikva, Israel) as a clinical practice site for 5 years until May 16, 2030. The accreditation covers the pediatric speciality.

The Schneider Children's Hospital Medical Center (Petah Tikva, Israel) has 278 beds and is led by Prof. Oded Scheuerman, a pediatric specialist, university professor, and department head with 20 years of experience.

The hospital's key patient care data

- The annual outpatient patient volume is: 250,000 people/year.
- They have all types of specializations.
 - The diagnostic capabilities are also extensive. A clinical biochemical laboratory is available, and X-ray, CT, MRI, and PET-CT are also accessible within the institution.
- The center trains 90 residents annually, with a total of 250 specialists, 220 of whom hold more than one board certification.
 - Each year, 120 medical students train at the center for 280 hours over 8 weeks. Additionally, 90 residents participate in specialist training, with a workload of 18-20 hours per week.
 - They provide pediatric training for sixth-year medical students, but did not specify the number of students they accept.

Based on the overall impression, the Visiting Committee's assessment of the Schneider Children's Hospital Medical Center (Petah Tikva, Israel) as a clinical training site for the Hungarian Accreditation Committee is positive.

For our students' final year of medical training, the hospital provides thorough and valuable knowledge in pediatrics. The laboratory, equipment, and personnel requirements are fully met.

We recommend granting a 5-year accreditation to Schneider Children's Hospital Medical Center.
